NEW FACES AT THE FARM

Thankfully – HOPEFULLY – the blazing hot, humid, and violent summer weather is behind us and we can enjoy the cool days, crisp nights, and brilliant blue skies of autumn. From all of us at The Oasis Animal Sanctuary, we pray for our communities that have been so terribly affected by the recent floods and tornadoes, and wish you all continued security, compassion, and wellbeing during these unprecedented times.

Because of last year's closures of spay/neuter clinics, as well as severely limited vet appointments for patients, there is an explosion of kittens being born. 21 of the 37 animals surrendered to Oasis so far this year were kittens, or very young cats with a litter of babies. In the spring newsletter the stories of Bobbi the pregnant Manx cat, and Peanut, Penny & Piper were told. Thankfully, those 7 have all found wonderful new homes, as did 2 other kittens – Mookie and Harper. Now we have the following babies needing new homes:

Willow – a VERY young torti mom who gave birth to 6 kittens. She was unable to feed them all so we had to help. As they were weaned from Mom, Willow "adopted" **Shiloh**, a kitten that someone left at the sanctuary. A beautiful brown and black striped female, Shiloh found solace with Willow and bonded tightly with her. All of the kittens are now young teenagers. **Oakley** and **Maple** were adopted, but **Forest** (solid gray male), **Aspen** and **Juniper** (solid black females) and **Ivy** (gray striped female) are available, as well as Willow and Shiloh who need to be adopted together.

Phoebe – Hunger forced this tiny kitten past her fear of people and she cried softly to a woman sitting at an outside table at a local restaurant. The emaciated baby had no way of knowing the woman was an Oasis Trustee, who scooped up the pathetic creature and brought her in. She was "skin and bones", at just 1.5 pounds. Named Phoebe, she was examined by a vet and found to have no communicable diseases, but was severely underweight and had a urinary tract infection. Medications were given; little Phoebe is better and has now doubled her weight!

Talia – This little kitten was found on the median of a busy highway! With eyes crusted over and a raging upper respiratory infection, this 6 week old baby needed help asap. Talia was immediately taken to a local animal hospital where she was examined and provided the medication she desperately needed. With rest, medicines, and proper nutrition, the little one recovered and is now a happy kitten bursting with playfulness and energy. What a turnaround from just a few weeks earlier!

And there are more adult cats too – mostly coming in from families of caregivers who have passed away. Some are permanent residents, but others are looking for their forever home, like:

Ben – a GORGEOUS, ridiculously friendly, solid gray male whose personality is so outgoing he could probably be a therapy cat. This is a very loveable guy who just wants attention! He gets along with the kittens and tolerates other adult cats and just loves people. Ben is 4 years old, up to date on shots and neutered.

Snowflake – A sweet but shy 10 year old black and white female, Snowflake has gotten over her apprehension of a new home and now sits in her favorite rocking chair with volunteers, loving the pets and attention. Snowflake lived with another female cat and a dog, but seems now to want all the attention to herself.

All of the cats tested negative for Feline AIDS and Leukemia, are up to date on vaccines, sterilized, and socialized with humans and other cats.
